2025 POOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. **NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY** Swim at your own risk.
- 2. All members/residents and guests must sign-in upon entrance to the pool area.
- 3. THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: When thunder occurs, all individuals must leave the pool area. The pool area will be reopened when conditions permit.
- FOR SAFETY REASONS Pool furniture must be kept at least six (6) feet from the edge of the pool.
- 5. Restrooms shall not be used as changing rooms. Dripping bathing suits and bare feet are not allowed in the clubhouse and restroom.
- 6. Atalltimes members/residents and/or guests 16 or over must display numbered plastic badges for admission to the pool area.
- 7. Children 15 or under must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult and must be signed in. No child aged 2-15 will be allowed in the pool between 1pm and 5pm except on Saturdays, when they are allowed in the pool from 12pm - 5pm. Children under the age of 2 are not allowed in the pool at any time. Diapers are not permitted at any age.
- Bathers must wear suitable bathing suits or swim wear. Cut-off pants or jeans are not permitted in the pool.
- 9. Flotation objects, such as inflatable tubes, kickboards, and flippers, arenot permitted in the pool. Styrofoam belts and arm "swimmies" will be permitted in the pool when an adult is in the pool with the child.
- 10. Diving is not permitted at any time.
- 11. Jumping is not permitted at any time.

12. Snacks, plastic bottles and cans are permitted inside the pool area and must be consumed at a table. NO GLASS OR ALCOHOL IS ALLOWED. Picnic tables are available outside the pool area for those having sandwiches, subs, pizza, etc.

> A charcoal grill is available for your use outside the pool area. A fire shovel and ash can are also provided. Please clean up after use.

Garbage and recyclables must be disposed of in the receptacles that are provided outside of the pool entrance.

- 13. No sports, including ball playing or horseplay, will be permitted in the pool area. Children may have dive toys in the shallow end of the pool. Running is not permitted in the pool area. Loud music is not permitted.
- 14. No animals, except for service animals, shall be allowed in the swimming pool enclosure. (N.J.A.C.8:26)
- 15. Smoking and "vaping" is permitted only at the end of the sidewalk in the parking area. Smoking and "vaping" are not permitted near the pool area or in any other sports area.
- 16. Chairs, tables and lounges are available to residents on first come basis. THEY MAY NOT BE RESERVED. Please bring chairs for your guests.
- 17. Upon exiting the pool area, please return chairs and lounges to their regular locations. Umbrellas are to be rolled down and tied.
- 18. Our pool maintenance company is Specialized Pools.



Buildings & Grounds committee members will soon be out and about performing the 'Spring Walk-throughs' to assess the condition of buildings, recreational areas and common grounds.

There are green survey stakes located behind the homes adjacent to common ground/green space, identifying the boundary of residents' property. The area behind these green stakes must be left in its natural state. Residents may not encroach into this space to extend gardens, may not clear the area or store personal items such as bird baths or outdoor furniture. Any concerns with trees in common areas should be reported to the Office and will be followed up by the Buildings & Grounds Committee.

Trees located between residents' properties are the responsibility of the homeowner. Issues related to trees on residents' properties should be addressed directly to the homeowner.

The painting of houses will be commencing soon. The 2025 schedule is listed in the March Lions Pride. This year's schedule includes homes on Lauren Lane and Lions Head Boulevard South. Painting includes original wood elements. Those that have been updated and replaced with vinyl products are not included in the painting contract.

We've survived the long, dreary winter months and sunshine has come back out to play. The soil is thawing, and you're about to embrace gardening once again. April has finally arrived.

Our first meeting of 2025 was held on March 12. Because of our Pride deadline, I am unable to give a report. We'll catch up next month.

Cool-season annuals like pansies and violas can be potted up and no plant is too common to become a garden star. Maybe make this the year you celebrate easy, longblooming winners like marigolds and zinnias.

If you prepared your gardens in the fall or last month, you are all set to go.

- Enrich the soil by the addition of compost, fertilizer or mulch where needed
- Trim forsythia and lilacs after bloom is gone
- Divide and transplant crowded perennials
- Deadhead tulips and daffodils but leave foliage to die naturally

REMINDERS:

This year Arbor Day in New Jersey is celebrated on Friday April 25, the same day as National Arbor Day

- in the United States. Plant a tree or support your local arboretum.
- Be aware the upcoming months of May and June are the greatest season for tick bites.
- When working outdoors, use precautions like wearing light clothing and check yourself carefully when returning inside. Also, protect yourself with sunscreen and try to utilize early morning hours to avoid the hot sun.

If you lost it or missed it, here is my favorite recipe for a homemade weed killer - easy to make, cheap, safe and it works.

Heat 1 quart of white vinegar (any kind)

Add 2 cups of Epsom salt (stir till all dissolved)

Add 1/4 cup of dish soap (any kind)

When cool, transfer to a spray bottle and go to work. Great for weeds in cement cracks or between blocks. Larger weeds may need a second application.

Plans for the community Butterfly Garden are ongoing. Stay tuned. More in the next edition of Pride. But you can still help now. Remember to plant the only plant that supports the Monarch Butterfly – milkweed. If we each planted only one, our community would be adding to the National effort to save the Monarch. Be sure to check our bulletin board. Prepared by Lucy Coburn, it is beautifully done and has a great deal of important information about bees.

Happy Spring!

Just a few reminders that with tax season upon us it is important to be aware of scammers who are out in force with seniors as their prime target! Here are a few scary facts:

According to recent FBI data, senior citizens in the United States are scammed out of approximately \$3.4 billion each year, with the number of complaints and losses increasing steadily. The average senior victim loses around \$33,915 per scam!

Here are the three scams that top the list of complaints for seniors:

1. **Tech support scams.** In fact, when it comes to fraud committed against older adults, *tech support scams top the list.* Typically, a person's computer or phone screen will freeze or go blank. A pop-up message will appear with a phone number to dial for help. When the user calls it, the scammer on the other end will ask for permission to log on to the device remotely. This fake "tech support" representative also may demand a fee to repair the "issue." **SHUT DOWN COMPUTER**, WAIT 5 minutes and reboot - it should be gone - if not, shut down until you get it to a reliable repair person.

- 2. Government impersonation scams. Callers pretend to be from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Social Security Administration, or Medicare. They may threaten to cut off Social Security or Medicare benefits unless the person provides personal details. HANG UP! All correspondence with these agencies are via USPS NEVER on the telephone.
- 3. **Financial services scam.** These cons work because they appear to come from a legitimate source: a bank, a mortgage company, or a debt collection agency using fake caller ID telephone numbers. **Hang up!** Call your bank or financial institution to verify if there is an issue **NEVER** give personal information over the phone!

Even better than hanging up is to **not answer the phone at all and let it go to voicemail** - better to be safe than sorry!

1/8 tsp. each ground clove, powdered ginger, chili powder

& ground cardamon

Directions:

Mix all together & store the mixture in an airtight container for months.

Flounder Italian Style

Ingredients:

4 med. size flounder filets

1 tsp. kosher salt

1/4 tsp. black pepper

4 tbsps. salted butter melted

2 tbsps. lemon juice

2 cloves garlic minced

1/2 cup of PANKO

1 tsps. paprika

1 tbsp. ITALIAN seasoning

Olive oil spray

<u>GARNISH FOR SERVING:</u> 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, 1/4 cup finely chopped parsely, 4 lemon wedges

Directions:

- 1. Prepare the air fryer basket lined with aluminum foil. Spray lightly with olive oil.
- 2. Sprinkle fish with kosher salt then rinse fillets & pat dry with paper towel. Place each fillet in the basket.
- 3. In a small bowl mix melted butter, lemon juice, garlic, Italian seasoning and panko. Sprinkle over fillets, then sprinkle with paprika.
 - 4. AIR FRY at 350° for 8 -10 mins, until opaque.
- 5. Place in serving dish and sprinkle with parmesan cheese and parsley. Serve with lemon wedges on the side.

<u>AIR FRYER Cinnamon Apples</u> - recipe from Marie Sino <u>Ingredients:</u>

2 large apples

2 tsps. unsalted butter

1 tsp. cinnamon

3 tbsps. pure maple syrup

2 tbsps. brown sugar

1/4 tsp. nutmeg

1 tsp vanilla extract

Directions:

- 1. Peel & core apples, slice into thick slices (approx. 1/2").
- 2. Combine in a mixing bowl, cinnamon, maple syrup, brown sugar, nutmeg & vanilla extract. Place apples on a plate and season with mixture.
 - 3. Preheat air fryer basket to 350°.
- 4. Lightly grease the basket with butter and SINGLE layer the apple slices in the basket.
- 5. Air fry for 15-20 mins. After 7 mins. turn the slices over and reposition each slice for even cooking.
 - 6. SERVE warm topped with ICE CREAM.
