



BUILDING & GROUNDS

As you read this, spring flowers have emerged and bloomed, the grass is green and growing, birds are nesting and trees have returned to life, blossoming and showering the ground with an array of colorful petals. Buildings & Grounds Committee members are well under way with all related seasonal projects.

As our community was carved out of the Pinelands, we are tasked with caring for trees by State and Township regulations. The LHS Tree Meeting, held on April 30th, was well attended, provided much information and clarification of tree management. For any who missed the meeting, the presentation can be found on the LHS website.

Additional points to know before digging into the ground for planting, patio building, tree and root removal, etc.:

- 1. A requisition is required for Federal Irrigation for assessment and location of underground irrigation and sprinkler system structures. The requisitions are located in the box outside the rear clubhouse entrance.
- 2. As LHS has underground utilities, New Jersey Law requires you to contact 'New Jersey One Call' at least 3 business days before beginning ANY underground work. Dial "811" or 800-272-1000.

This is a free service which ensures safe digging, protection of underground utilities, prevention of interrupted services, expensive repairs, project delays and costly fines.

At our April meeting, much discussion and planning were done considering our plans for gardens and planters in the various areas of the community. These include the Clubhouse entrances, various gardens, pool area and tier garden in addition to assisting with the flowers at the front entrance to the community.

By now our Community Butterfly Garden is completed. This endeavor is a part of our efforts to aid pollinators, especially the Monarch Butterfly which is seriously diminishing in numbers. We will keep a watch on our plants and take care to keep them healthy and safe from deer. This has been a long planning process, and we are grateful to the Building and Grounds Committee and our Board of Trustees for their cooperation in bringing this to completion.

June is here with its beautiful days of bright and warm sun. June 20th is the first day of summer with the longest hours of daylight and it's National Rose Month as well as Perennial Gardening Month.

Some perennial plants for you to consider:

HOSTAS -- Brighten shady spots in your garden and are super-easy foliage plants that come in different shapes, sizes, and color. As a bonus, Hostas develop graceful spikes of lavender or white blooms that will lure hummingbirds to your garden.

PEONIES -- Add peonies to your garden if you're looking for low-maintenance perennial flowers that will bloom every year without fail. They produce masses of large, fragrant spring blooms in colors that include pink, coral, white, red, cream, and bicolor.

CONEFLOWER -- A gardener's favorite for a very good reason. They are heat tolerant, drought tolerant, come in a rainbow of colors, self-seed, and they attract pollinators (always a plus).

If you are a container gardener. A fact sheet for container gardening is available from the Rutgers Cooperative Research and Extension Station at 1623 Whitesville Road in Toms River or call 732-349-1245. We are very fortunate to have this source of information available to us. If you haven't used them yet, give it a try. If you have used them, won't you share your experience with us. Contact Carmela Ferraro.

Tips for June Gardeners

- Apply slow-release fertilizer to annuals.
- Clematis and wisteria vines should be trimmed back after they bloom.
- Check roses for black spot and powdery mildew. Treat accordingly.
- Help control mosquitos by removing standing water. A **teaspoon** is enough for a mosquito to lay eggs.

Your Garden Club works hard providing color and beauty to our surroundings. We meet on the second Wednesday of each month. Our next meeting is June 11, in the Lion's Den at 10:30 AM. We'd love to have you join us and consider being a part of this active group.

SIMPLE FRUIT KABOBS - using beef, shrimp or pork **Ingredients:**

1 lb beef (your choice), pork tenderloins - into thick cubes, or jumbo shrimp

1 med orange (juiced & peeled)

1/4 cup chopped fresh cilantro

1 tbsp. smoked paprika

1 tsp. red pepper

4 cups LARGE chunks of peaches, plums, pineapple, watermelon

Salt & pepper to taste

Directions:

- 1. Marinade...PLACE meat or shrimp in a plastic bag add orange juice, orange peel, cilantro, paprika and red pepper. Turn to coat and refrigerate for 1/2 hour.
- 2. Thread meat or shrimp evenly onto 2-3 skewers (metal or bamboo (if using bamboo, soak in water for 10 mins)). Alternating, meat or shrimp with pineapple only. Skewer ALL remaining fruit SEPARATELY!
- 3. PREPARE GRILL to med-high heat. Place skewers 8-10 mins for beef; 10 12 mins. for pork; 3- 5 mins until shrimp are pink. Turning all occasionally. Season with salt & pepper.

4. Grill fruit skewers for 5 mins. or until soft & turning brown.

LEMON RICOTTA POUND CAKE - 1 bowl cake **Ingredients:**

3 eggs

1 1/2 cups whole milk ricotta cheese

3/4 cup oil (any type)

2 tbsp lemon liqueur

1 1/2 cup of sugar

1 tsp kosher salt

zest of 2 lemons

2 1/2 tsp baking powder

1/1/2 cup of all-purpose flour

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°
- 2. Prepare a 9x5" loaf pan lined with parchment paper.
- 3. In a large bowl whisk eggs & ricotta cheese, Add oil, and liqueur and blend.
 - 4. Add sugar, salt, zest & whisk again.
- 5. Add baking powder & flour, using a spatula until blended well.
- 6. Pour into baking pan, bake approx. 50-60 mins. until toothpick removes clean.

orange slice

lime slice

blueberries



- 1. NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY Swim at your own risk.
- 2. All members/residents and guests must sign-in upon entrance to the pool area.
- THUNDER AND LIGHTNING: When thunder occurs, all individuals must leave the pool area. The pool area will be reopened when conditions permit.
- 4. FOR SAFETY REASONS Pool furniture must be kept at least six (6) feet from the edge of the pool.
- Restrooms shall not be used as changing rooms. Dripping bathing suits and bare feet are not allowed in the clubhouse and restroom.
- 6. At all times members/residents and/or guests 16 or over must display numbered plastic badges for admission to the pool area
- Children 15 or under must be accompanied and supervised by a responsible adult and must be signed in. No child aged 2-15 will be allowed in the pool between 1pm and 5pm except on Saturdays, when they are allowed in the pool from 12pm – 5pm. Children under the age of 2 are not allowed in the pool at any time. Diapers are not permitted at any age.
- 8. Bathers must wear suitable bathing suits or swim wear. Cut-off pants or jeans are not permitted in the pool.
- 9. Flotation objects, such as inflatable tubes, kickboards, and flippers, arenot permitted in the pool. Styrofoam belts and arm "swimmies" will be permitted in the pool when an adult is in the pool with the child.
- 10. Diving is not permitted at any time.
- Jumping is not permitted at any time.

12. Snacks, plastic bottles and cans are permitted inside the pool area and must be consumed at a table. NO GLASS OR ALCOHOL IS ALLOWED. Picnic tables are available outside the pool area for those having sandwiches, subs, pizza, etc.
