



SURVEY SAYS!

Several months ago, we asked residents to complete a survey to gather information to better serve our residents. We received a total of 147 responses with 90 suggestions for events. Considering we have 615 homes - this is a good response. The exact results were distributed to the Board of Trustees, club and committee chair people.

Overwhelmingly, people wanted more bus trips, whether they are daily to AC, NY, or PA for Sight and Sound or sporting events, overnight to Cape May or longer to Vermont, Maine, etc. The issue in the past has been a lack of interest and then trips have been canceled.

While we cannot endorse or recommend companies, in doing an online search there are two travel companies - Garden State Getaways 732-689-2251 and Gary's **Fun Tours 609-857-6000-200**, that offer the type of tours suggested by the residents and the pickup location is at Target on Rt. 70. Their websites have all the information you need to book a tour.

There were also many responses about having more events in the Clubhouse, Zumba, line dancing, game nights as well as monthly dances, rock and roll bands etc. For the game nights, residents can organize them on their own or put on the Pulse which has worked well in the past. As for monthly events, we try to space them out and vary them to ensure they are well attended and there is always the cost of putting on the event. Committees try to keep them reasonable so more people can attend but it can be a challenge.

There are two book clubs already formed, one during the day and one in the evenings. However, people can post on the Pulse or we can put it in the Pride, that a new Book Club is looking for members and then organize yourselves - it doesn't have to be approved by any committee - just check with Karen in office to make sure there is no conflict in using the Clubhouse.

We received good information from the survey; and will use it going forward in planning events. We appreciate all those who participated. You can always contact the committee chairs directly to give your input. Thank you for help in making LHS the best it can be!

Renate grew up in Kiel in northern Germany by the Baltic Sea. She emigrated from Bremerhaven, Germany to New York City on the SS United States in March 1961. This was the fastest ship at the time and crossed the Atlantic in only 5 days. However, Renate was sick during the entire crossing, eating in the dining room only twice during the trip; she ate dinner on the first day and breakfast on the fifth day!

The SS United States made many ocean crossings and was retired in 1969. This glorious ocean liner had been docked at Pier 82 on the Delaware River in Philadelphia from 1994 until this past February. On February 19, 2025, with great fanfare, the S.S. United States was towed down the river to the Atlantic Ocean and now she is docked just south of Mobile, Alabama undergoing preparation to eventually serve as the world's largest artificial reef off the coast of Florida.

The first picture below is Renate on her SS United States voyage from Bremerhaven, Germany to New York City in March 1961. The next picture is the SS United States being towed down the Delaware River on February 19, 2025.







Renate and her husband, Klaus raised their family in Bergen County but always talked about moving to the shore when he retired. In 1993, Klaus passed away before he could retire and her children moved on with their lives; Renate decided to move to Tinton Falls to be closer to her friends who had already moved to LHS. After much encouragement Renate and her dog, Fritz, a Shih Tzu, made the move to LHS in 2002. She remembers meeting many nice people on her daily walks with Fritz. Renate joined the Chorus for the 2002 Christmas Concert and has been singing in every concert since then! She also joined the Garden Club, delivered the Pride, helped out in the kitchen with the Lionettes (now known as The Women's Club), and sold tickets and chances at the monthly meetings. The pictures below show Renate and friends participating in an LHS Octoberfest and with a group of knitters and crocheters, called the 'Rip it Out' Club. Renate says that she has never been bored living here, and that there is so much to do at LHS.



#### "SALADS for the SUMMER"

Transition into the hot summer days of AUGUST 2025 with quick, easy and light salads. Then finish with a **GREAT COFFEE CAKE!** 

The following recipes were offered by LHS friends! Thank you Sandy DeCarlo and Barbara Hurley for your ideas & recipes!

Orzo Lemon Parmesan Salad - this perfect summer dish has the character of "Risotto" in the process of preparing. It's not gluten free but you could use with gluten free alternatives.

#### **Ingredients:**

1 tbsp. of Olive Oil

1 1/2 cup dry Orzo

2 cloves garlic - smashed

3 cups chicken broth

1 lemon zested

1/2 of a lemon juiced

1 1/2 cups frozen peas

1 tsp. fresh thyme

salt & pepper to taste

#### **Directions:**

- 1. In a med skillet, add orzo & olive oil. Cook & stir until orzo is toasted, approx. 1 min.
  - 2. Add garlic and thyme, stir well.
- 3. Add chicken broth, bring to a boil, cover & simmer low for 8 - 10 mins. The pasta needs to absorb all the liquid.
- 4. Remove lid, add lemon zest, lemon juice & peas. Stir until peas are cooked.
- 5. Add Parmesan cheese... then salt & pepper to taste. **VEGGIE OPTIONS>** RED BELL PEPPER, MUSH-ROOMS, CARROTS, BROCCOLI....in place of peas. The

pasta can be stored in an air tight container up to 4 days!

Avocado Crab Salad - My favorite time of the year to "DROP LINE CRAB CATCH" in Barnegat Bay is August! Blue claws are plentiful, meaty & tasty. Recipe from Sue Auer.

#### **Ingredients:**

8 oz. lump crab meat (canned crab meat can be used). If you choose to use fresh crabs, steam, cool & remove all meat).

1/4 cup mayonnaise

2 tsp. lemon zest

2 tsp. lemon juice

1 celery stalk finely chopped

1 scallion, finely chopped

1/2 tsp. Old Bay seasoning

1 dash Worcestershire sauce

1 tbsp. ketchup

2 peeled avocados, split in half - remove pit

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Combine all ingredients, stir well & chill
- 2. Prepare avocados & place on serving dish
- 3. Fill each avocado half with approx. 2 heaping tbsps. of crab mixture

GARNISH-WITH....dried Parsley & 1/2 grape tomato

Honey Poppyseed Fruit Salad - No cholesterol, 90 calories, 5 grams of fiber. It doesn't get any healthier than this quick 10-minute tasty salad!

#### **Ingredients:**

2 med. firm bananas

2 cups fresh blueberries

2 cups fresh raspberries

5 tbsp. honey

1 tsp. fresh lemon juice

2 tsp. poppy seeds

#### **Directions:**

- 1. In a large bowl, combine berries & bananas
- 2. In a small bowl, combine honey, lemon juice & poppyseeds. STIR LIGHTLY
  - 3. Pour honey mix over fruit, toss to coat & cool

Cinnamon Coffee Cake - A mahjong group favorite

from Barb Hurley.

Ingredients:

For cake batter:

1 stick of softened butter

3/4 cup sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

1 egg

2 cups of flour

2 tsp. baking powder

pinch salt

3/4 cups of milk

FILLING: in small bowl, pinch all (below) & form soft crumbs

3 tbsp. softened butter

1 tbsp cinnamon

1/2 cup flour

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

TOPPING: In a food processor, add all (below) & pulse until coarse crumbs are formed. (if a processor is not available, use a pastry cutter).

5 tbsp. softened butter

3/4 cups of flour

1/2 cup of brown sugar

1 tbsp. cinnamon

#### **Directions:** - PREHEAT OVEN TO 350°

- 1. In a mixer bowl, cream butter & sugar. Add & mix in, vanilla & egg. scraping down sides.
- 2. In a separate bowl, combine the flour, baking powder & salt (dry ingredients).
- 3. Add 1/2 dry ingredients to mixer, when mostly combined, add milk.
- 4. When milk is incorporated, add the balance of dry ingredients.
- 5. Grease a 9x9 pan. Pour 1/2 cake mix into pan, spread corner to corner. Sprinkle FILLING over top. Pour the remaining cake batter & spread carefully across the top (try not to disturb the cinnamon filling).
- 6. Sprinkle **TOPPING** over the remaining batter layer, press lightly. Bake 45 50 mins. Cool on wire rack.
